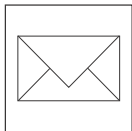

Notes:

1. Full details of the resolution to be proposed at the In-Scope Members Court Meeting, with explanatory notes, are set out in the Notice of the Court Meetings provided with this form of proxy. Further details of the Scheme are set out in the circular relating to the Scheme published by MDDUS on 20 January 2020 (**Scheme Circular**) and is available to view and download at www.mddus.com/scheme. Terms defined in the Scheme Circular shall apply to this form of proxy unless the context otherwise requires.
2. Entitlement to attend and cast one vote at the In-Scope Members Court Meeting, or any adjournment thereof, shall be determined by reference to those members identified by MDDUS as In-Scope Members on its Register of Members at 5:00 p.m. on 7 February 2020, or if the meeting is adjourned, on the day which is two Business Days before the date of such adjourned meeting. In each case, changes to the Register of Members after that time shall be disregarded.
3. For your proxy appointment to be valid, you must either: (i) complete, sign and return this form of proxy to Civica Election Services using the pre-paid envelope provided with this form of proxy or to Civica Election Services, The Election Centre, 33 Clarendon Road, London N8 0NW or (ii) appoint a proxy online by going to www.cesvotes.com/mddus20. In each case, not less than two Business Days before the time of the In-Scope Members Court Meeting (in other words, by 10:00 a.m. on 7 February 2020) or, as the case may be, the adjourned In-Scope Members Court Meeting. This form of proxy may also be handed to Civica Election Services, on behalf of the chair of the In-Scope Members Court Meeting, before the start of the In-Scope Members Court Meeting (or, as the case may be, the adjourned In-Scope Members Court Meeting) and it will still be valid.
4. An In-Scope Member may appoint a proxy, who need not be a Scheme Member to exercise all or any of his or her rights to attend, speak and vote on his or her behalf. If you sign and return this form of proxy with no name inserted in the space provided, the chair of the In-Scope Members Court Meeting will be deemed to be your proxy. To appoint as your proxy a person other than the chair of the In-Scope Members Court Meeting, insert their full name in BLOCK CAPITALS in the space provided. Where you appoint as your proxy someone other than the chair of the In-Scope Members Court Meeting, you are responsible for ensuring that he or she attends the meeting and that he or she is aware of your voting intentions. If you sign and return this form of proxy with your own name inserted in the space provided, it will be deemed that you will be attending the meeting in person to cast your vote, and if you do not attend your vote will not be counted.

Calls are charged at the standard geographic rate and will vary by provider. Calls outside the United Kingdom will be charged at the applicable international rate. 6. Completion of this form of proxy or the appointment of a proxy online will not prevent an In-Scope Member from attending and voting in person at the In-Scope Members Court Meeting, or any adjournment thereof, if they so wish. If an In-Scope Member appoints a proxy and then decides to attend the In-Scope Members Court Meeting in person and vote using their poll card, then their vote in person will override the proxy vote.
7. An In-Scope Member which is a company (a corporation) and which wishes to be represented at the In-Scope Members Court Meeting, has the right to appoint in writing a corporate representative to attend and vote at the meeting. Corporate representatives have the same powers on behalf of the corporation which they represent as that corporation could exercise as if it were an individual In-Scope Member. A corporate representative may be required to produce to Civica Election Services, on behalf of the chair of the In-Scope Members Court Meeting, the written authority to attend and vote at the relevant meeting at any time before the start of the meeting.
8. In the case of an individual, this form of proxy must be signed by the individual or his or her attorney. In the case of a corporation, this form of proxy must be executed under its common seal or under the hand of an officer or attorney duly authorised in writing.
9. Voting at the In-Scope Members Court Meeting will be by poll which may be conducted as the chair of the In-Scope Members Court Meeting shall determine. For the In-Scope Members Court Meeting (or any adjournment thereof) to be properly convened, a quorum of six In-Scope Members entitled to vote on the resolution proposed, each being an In-Scope Member or, where the In-Scope Member is a corporation, a duly authorised corporate representative, must be present in person or by proxy.
